The Baltimore City Department of Transportation (BCDOT) has switched the Dockless Vehicle Committee Meetings to a quarterly schedule. During off-months, you can expect an email update in lieu of a meeting. We're also considering widening the focus of this group to be all things micromobility- tell us what you think!

Announcements:

- The 2022 user survey has concluded! Attached to this email is a preview of the 783 responses received. Full results will be shared in the Dockless Vehicle annual report, expected to be released in May.
- Permit Rules and Regulation undergoing annual revision. The full draft of changes is expected to be
 released March 15 for public comment, but you can respond here if there are other issues or changes you
 would recommend be addressed in the new R&R. Attached to this email is an invite to the quarterly DVC
 meeting on April 13 where the changes will be discussed.
- **Spin was acquired by Tier Mobility.** Tier is now the largest micromobility company in the world based on number of vehicles. Spin has stated they will remain committed to the Baltimore City permit compliance, market, and relationships they have established here. Read the blog post here.

Other micromobility news:


- Personal Delivery Devices (PDD) are in Baltimore. Delivery robots were authorized in Maryland for a pilot
 period under the MDOT MVA, in partnership with local jurisdictions. Kiwibot is the first company to launch in
 Maryland, with 15 robots on the Morgan State University Campus. BCDOT, MVA, and MSU are coordinating to
