Love to Ride Central MD All Time Stats Update

The Baltimore region has been participating in Love to Ride since fall 2020. In that time 98 workplaces and 1,006 participants have biked over 870,000 miles and taken almost 53,000 bike rides. Through transportation bike trips, participants have prevented the equivalent of 53,000 pounds of CO2 from being emitted.

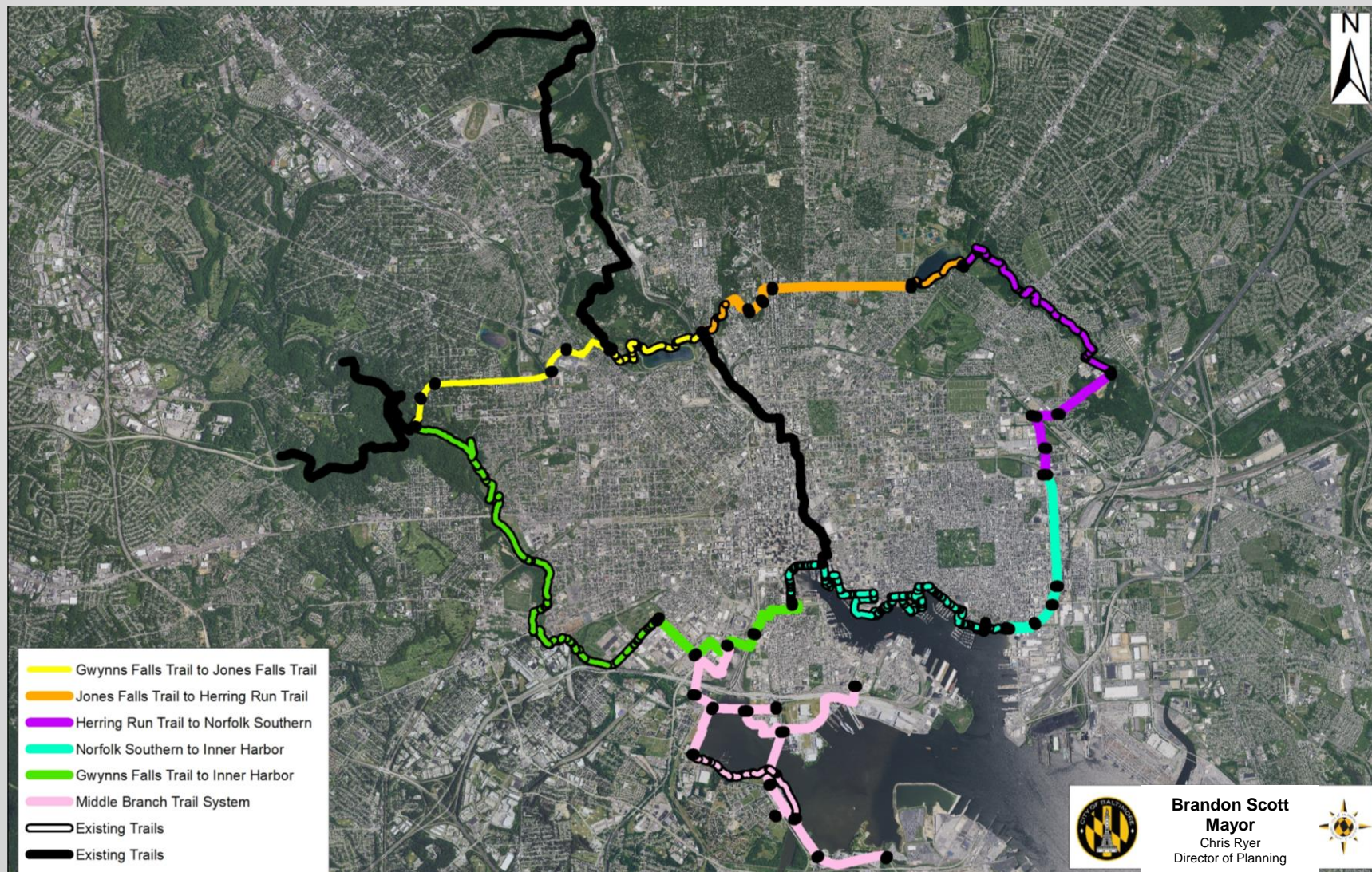

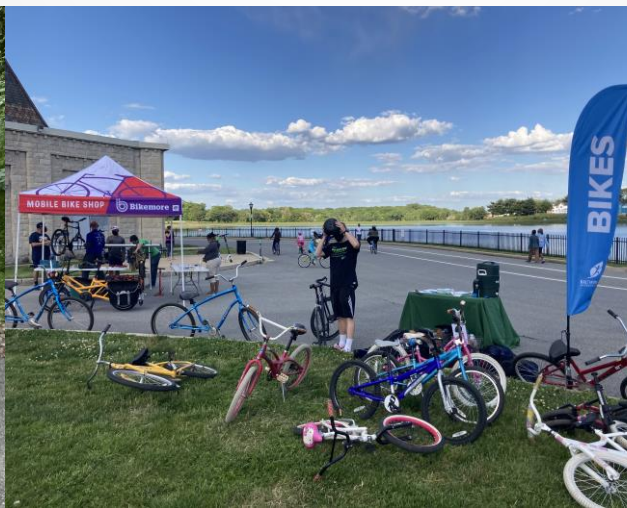
Immediate Action items:

- **Pump Track at Bocek Rec Center**
 1. Meet at Bocek (3000 E. Madison) from 3pm-6pm on Thursday, Oct. 7
 2. Pump track will be placed until end of October. Outdoor Rec staff will be at Bocek every Thursday from 3pm-6pm to teach youth.

- **2021 Fall Bike Programming**
 1. Saturday Lake Montebello and Herring Run rides 9am-3pm, end Oct. 30 (nearing 500 participants).
 2. Druid rides finished up Sept. 29 (164 participants).
 3. Thurs. Montebello rides ended Aug. 26 (300 participants).
 4. Rec Center rides at Gwynns Falls and Druid ended Aug. 12 (510 youth at 17 Centers)

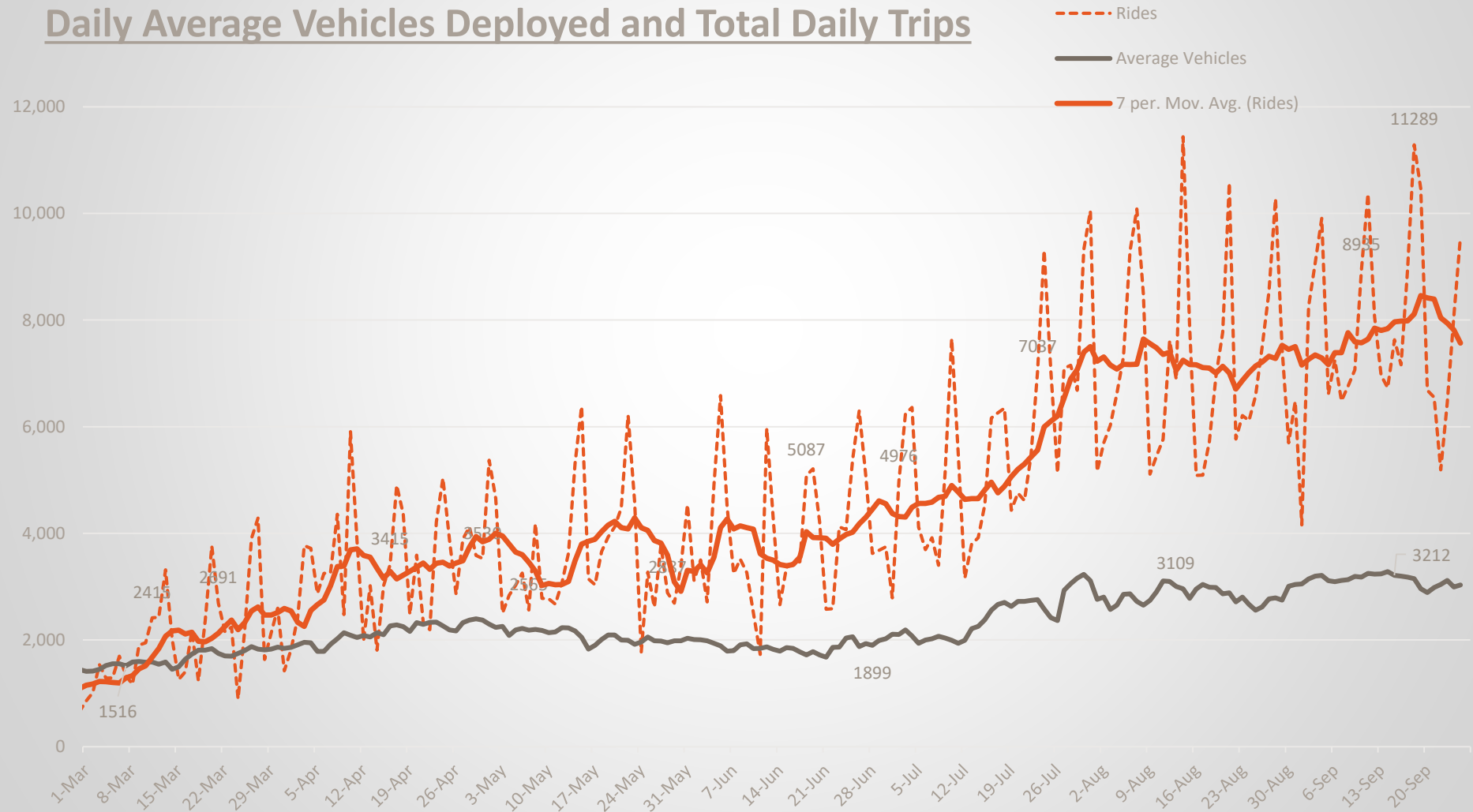
Updates: Rec-N-Parks

 3. Rec Center bike programs at Gwynns Falls and Rec Centers.



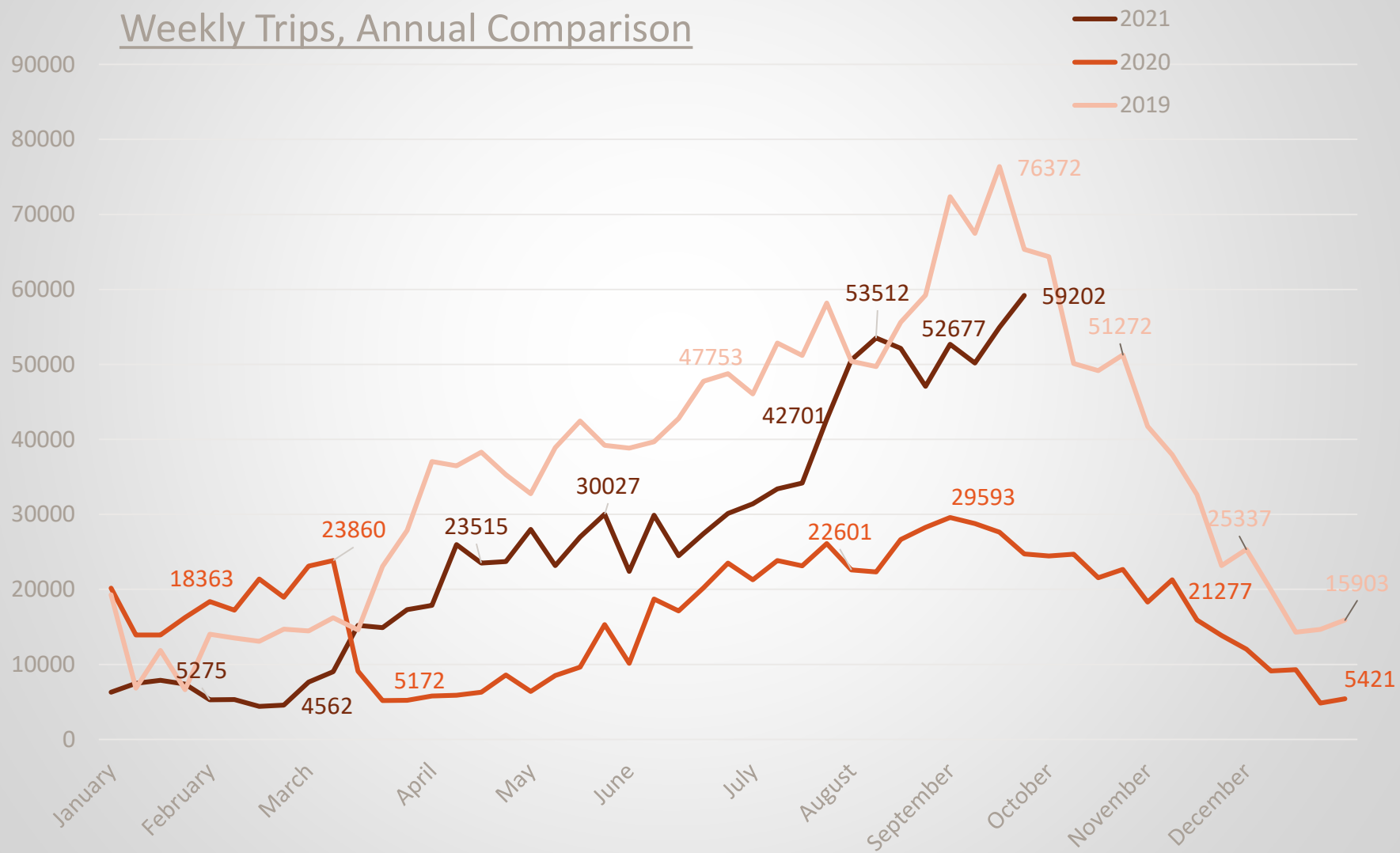
Dockless: Data Updates

Permit Holder Updates:

Lime

- Averaging 125 bicycle, working towards 150
- Adaptive tricycles, seated scooters, and wheelchairs approved. Rental process TBA through the Mayor's Commission on Disabilities.

Spin

- Approved for fleet increase to 1700 vehicles
- Launched automatic discounts in access zones

Link

- Approved for fleet increase to 1100 vehicles
- Adaptive tricycles and wheelchair attachments under review

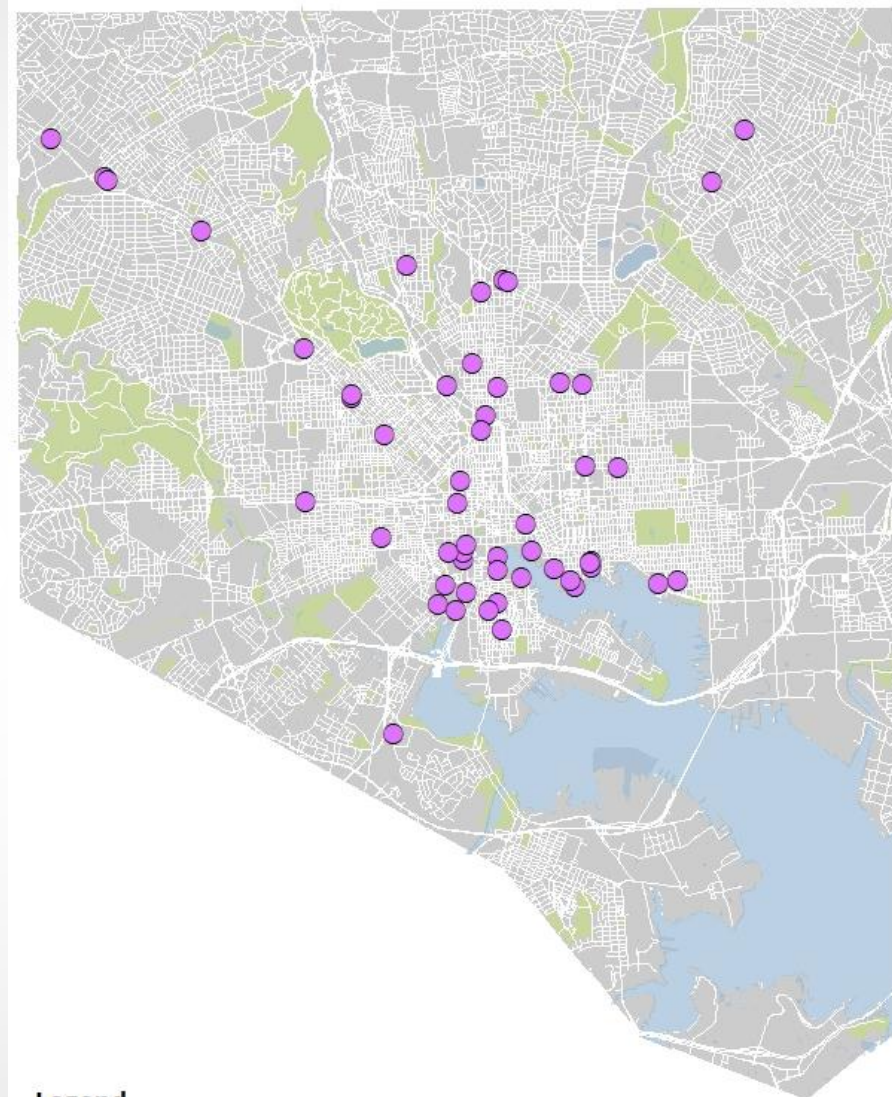

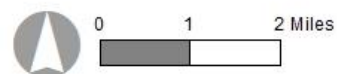

Updates: Rapid Enhancement Plan

Rapid Enhancement Plan Projects: Bikeways grant awarded!

- Award is for \$326,000 for Construction of four REP projects
- DOT has developed concepts and designs for each project
- Grant agreement must be finalized before work can begin
- Prioritizing the West Baltimore Bike Boulevard for immediate REP installations.
- Increased DOT staff capacity important factor in award

The Rapid Enhancement Plan addresses various gaps critical to the citywide bicycle network, including:

- **Mount Royal Streetscape:** Provide additional network connectivity by linking to the North Avenue Rising project, and improving a connection to Guilford Avenue and Jones Falls.
- **Sharp Street:** Extend the Maryland Avenue cycle-track through the Convention Center to Solo Gibbs Park and future connections to Middle Branch Trail.
- **Madison Street:** Provide an important neighborhood connection south of North Avenue and complementing current Bikeways Eutaw Street project (North to Wilson).
- **27th Street:** Extend the “Big Jump” footprint to other North/South bike corridors from Sisson Street to Barclay Street.

Updates: Bike Contract

Vision Zero and Bike Program Construction and Maintenance Contract

Important milestone for the bike program because this contract provides a mechanism for us to better execute Complete Streets projects in a timely manner.

- Approved by BOE today 9/29
- Bid awarded to P. Flanigan and Sons, Inc.
- Bid came in at \$1.3M
- Both Vision Zero and Bike projects

Majority of the contract is centered on quick build type materials such as striping and flex posts.

It does include a variety of other items such as:

- Bicycle friendly speed humps and grates
- Pot hole repair
- Curb installation, etc.
