

DOT – Complete Streets Update (Mr. Graham Young)

- 1. Resurfacing projects are incorporated with bike network, planning to do
 - a. University Parkway: 39th South Street to Charles in May
 - b. St Lo Drive: Harford Road to Sinclair Lane in Summer
- 2. University Park
 - a. Public Meeting Scheduled for April 13 for University Parkway
 - b. Ends at Charles with Bike Lanes
 - c. Connects to existing facility at 39th street
 - d. Bike Lane at 500 W University Park, parking sign needs to be removed
 - e. There are bike lanes north on university and bike lanes south on university connecting this to the lanes on Roland, but none of that is all ages like this facility.

f. Participant Comment: For University Parkway plans, I would recommend adding sidewalks as context, (apologies if that is only a road striping plan). It would assist in understanding pedestrian conflict points with cyclists better.

3. St. Lo Drive

- a. Do not want this to just be bike lanes but comfortable to walk
- b. End at Indian Head Drive
- c. Exploring lane not being a parking lane but tree pits instead
- d. Participant Question: Have we thought about how this affects Morgan State?
- e. Mr. Young Answer Not sure about Morgan State's Plan, this is only a striping project
- f. Commissioner Henderson: Will there be signage? Will it be phased?
- g. Mr. Young Answer: It will be Milled and Overlaid then repaved one half at a time, will be traffic calming signs as they go along, Will have to put in temporary markings, then comeback to strip, then they would do the flex post, curb stops, cross walks.
- h. Participant: What is the determinant factors fit guidelines?
- i. Mr. Young Just by doing striping work, allows us to do less lanes miles of resurfacing, to keep costs low
- j. Commissioner Barnes: Is there a way to cross the street heading to the Lake Clifton campus?
- k. Mr. Young: we don't have that in this plan right now because of the curve and lack of pedestrian activity there now but let me know if you thought it would make sense. We can also work with Morgan in the future when they do their construction work.
- I. Participant: Can we close Indian Head?
- m. Mr. Young: while I agree, some members of the community have expressed a strong desire to keep Indian Head open because of perception that a closed road encourages criminal activity

DOT - Biking Updates (Mr. Patrick Patterson)

- 5. Survey is Comprehensive and will take participants qualitative thoughts, community thoughts, locations, and more.
