
Superpedestrian continues to offer accessibility vehicles

Superpedestrian continues to provide new accessibility vehicles designed to accommodate a broader range of users, including individuals with mobility challenges and disabilities. These specialized vehicles include spacious seating, enhanced stability and user-friendly controls, making them more accessible and user-friendly for a diverse range of riders. Innovations like this align with our goals here at the Department of Transportation by providing last mile connectivity, reducing road congestion, and building inclusivity in with micromobility. Data Updates

With students returning to schools, there is a noticeable increase in the ridership of e-scooters around. Baltimore's universities. We attribute this increase to students who use scooters for more convenient and affordable methods of transportation. Also, school-related activities and events can increase the demand for quick and flexible transportation options. Trips to and from universities in 2022 are shown in the graph below. There was a large increase in micromobility trips to and from universities in the late summer when students returned to campus. Trips to and from universities in June 2022 to August 2022 accounted for 7% of citywide trips.



Compliance: DOT has implemented No Parking Zones on campuses that do not allow e-scooters and has installed parking corrals surrounding the No Parking Zones so students can neatly park vehicles outside of the No Parking Zones. The corrals around Johns Hopkins campus are shown below



If a scooter is in an improper location, you can have it moved. As a reminder, the fastest way to have a scooter moved is to contact the companies directly. Vehicles can be reported through the app or using the customer service numbers and emails listed on the vehicles or shown below.
