# 3. Working Session led by Kyle Leggs and Nick O'Gara from Baltimore City Department of Planning

- o Purpose of section is to review the Shared-Use Path Addendum
- Want to use this to presentation to talk about what the community wants for shared use paths
- The bike program was structured by nature and community corridors
- Centerpiece of amendment is all community corridors noted in the 2017 plan
- There is a history around bike lanes within Baltimore
- Using history to get Ideas on what were new ideas and what were previous ideas that roll over
- Shared Use paths are paved and accessible vs trails which are not held to the same standards
- Recommendations in 2006 plan called to develop off-road paths to create a connected trail system as part of the broader goal to develop a comprehensive network of facilities for bicyclists
  - Complete ongoing trail development projects.
  - Develop new and extend existing trails.
  - Improve neighborhood access to trails.
- 2015 Plan did not talk about projects already made



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- $\circ$   $\;$  Looking at the Addendum allows us to look at prior planning efforts like:
  - Baltimore Greenway Trails Network
    - Northern Segments (33rd Street Connector and the Gwynn Falls Connector)
    - Eastern Segments (Southeast Connector)
    - Southern Segments
  - Additional Trail Concepts
    - Carroll Park Heritage Trail
    - Connecting Waterfront Promenade to Ft. McHenry and Maryland Cruise Terminal
- This will allow us to seek funding, start planning, and coordinate implementation
- Making sure the standards are consistent with the Baltimore Complete Streets Manual and other manuals located in the city
- Community Engagement has been both enthusiastic support and opposition
  - Opposition is because of increased housing costs and parking loss or automotive driving practices
  - Using the Complete Streets Manual for equitable community engagement
  - Do not compromise with the Mayor's Green House Gas Emissions Reductions Goals
- Moving to document and include these into the plan
