







- Bike Sharrows in right-most driving lane
- Jones Falls Trail side path stops at Guilford Avenue
- Interstate 83 slip-lane onto Mount Royal Avenue





















Opportunity to Continue Track

Continue the course of the Jones Falls Trail onto Mount Royal Avenue





Design Alternative 1: Improved Crossings & Sight Lines

- Two driving lanes
- Baltimore City Parking Authority metered lane
- Interstate 83 slip lane onto Mount Royal Avenue
- Strengthen Jones Falls Trail crossings from Guilford Avenue to Saint Paul Street





















Design Alternative 1: Improved Crossings & Sight Lines

- Clarify where cyclists should ride and cross intersections within the Jones Falls Trail
- Increase overall visibility of cyclists on trail for people who walk and people who drive


















Design Alternative 1: Improved Crossings & Sight Lines




- Two driving lanes
- Baltimore City Parking Authority metered lane
- Mount Royal Avenue Jones Falls Trail segment
 - Direct cyclist onto sidewalk onto trail
 - Cycle crosswalks at intersections
- Bike sharrows in right-most driving lane



Design Alternative 2: Floating Parking & Separated Bike Lane

One driving lane, two-way separated bike lane protected from moving traffic by BCPA metered parking

Maryland Avenue and West Chase St Separated Bike Lane


- One driving lane

- Two-way separated bike lane protected from moving traffic by floating parking



Bike Parking Updates and Requirements







How does Baltimore City promote bike parking?

- City zoning code requires developers to install both short- and long-term bike parking (# of spaces depends on building size and use)
- Property owners can install bike parking themselves with a minor privilege permit (w/ support from façade grants through BIDs)
- If not required by zoning, an owner or manager can request bike parking from BCDOT
- If new bike parking does not prevent ADA access or have other interferences, BCDOT places request on a 3-6 month install queue
- CCB 21-011 was introduced to update many zoning requirements (including bike parking)





What does CCB 21-0113 do for bike parking?

- Update design standard exemptions to allow installation of smaller floor racks
- Requirement that no more than 80% of spaces can be wall or ceiling racks
- Define requirements for long-term spaces (e.g. security standards)
- Require any building where >9 long-term spaces are required to design 10% of spaces for cargo, family, or adaptive bike parking
- Change the motor vehicle parking offset so installing 8 required bike spaces reduces vehicle parking requirement by 1 (down from 12)



Updates: Planning

What is the status of CCB 21-0113?

- Last work session on July 26
- Next work session on September 13
- DOP staff expect to review amendments beginning mid-September
- CCB 210113 would go into effect 30 days after enactment
- Enactment expected no earlier than November 2022



Who enforces bike parking requirements?

With development review

- DOP staff review floor plan and/or site plan to check compliance w/ DOT guidelines
- If # of spaces doesn't meet requirements, applicant may request variance from BMZA
- # of bike parking spots may be notes in:
 - Developer's Agreement
 - EPlans permit

With no development review

- Zoning Administration permit reviewers may not check if zoning code requires bicycle parking
- If permit applicants are not informed of requirement prior to approval, enforcement is difficult
- DOP staff met w/ DHCD staff re: this issue previously; may benefit from additional support for permit reviewer/data collection by DOP




PUMP TRACK

- A potential permanent pump track at Carroll Park is in the works






Micromobility Updates

New Round of Corrals

- Will bring total to 124 parking corrals
- Percentage of vehicles parked on blocks with corrals will increase from approximately 18% to 25%.


In development - RFP to lead a coalition

Projects Overview: Three of four Projects near 100% Design

- Light: Baltimore to Conway
- Monroe Street: Eagle to Carroll (at 65%)
- Paca: Service Lane to Pratt
- Liberty Heights: Druid Park Drive to Wichita



Toward Zero "Quickbuild" Program





- As part of Baltimore City's "Toward Zero" initiative, DOT identified four high-crash locations for rapid implementation projects
- These "Quickbuild" projects incorporate cheap and easy-to-implement infrastructure – i.e. striping, paint, flex posts, and signage – to improve infrastructure safety at intersections and along corridors
- Project designs adhere to Baltimore's Complete Streets Manual, prioritizing the movement of pedestrians, cyclists, and transit riders
- Construction planned in Fall of 2022




