

**NOTICE: Department of Transportation Taking Public Comment on Proposed
Subtitle 09, Chapter 01 Traffic Calming Policy**

The Baltimore City Department of Transportation (BCDOT) is accepting public comment on the regulations for Traffic Calming beginning on Friday, February 4, 2022.

The proposed Traffic Calming regulation defines certain terms, updates the applicant petitioning process, provides a simple request process through the Baltimore City 311 System, replaces the petitioning process with an opt-out post card system, and incorporates a new data collection and prioritization system.
