

90 Day Permit Extension: Filed with Legislative Reference, effective June 9, 2020


- State of Emergency lifted
- BCDOT Releases final Rules & Regulation for 30 days of Public Comment
- BCDOT Releases Final Rules & Regulations and Public Comment Report
- Permit Application Opens
- Permits are awarded 60 days after State of Emergency is lifted
- New Permits become active 90 days after State of Emergency is lifted


Rules and Regulations Refinement:

Weekly Dockless Rides & Vehicles* Released


*For the pilot "Vehicles" and when previously reporting, the max number of vehicles were used. DOT will now use the daily average, as recommended by the MDC.





Daily Average Vehicles Deployed* and Total Daily Trips




Rides Per Vehicle Per Day*







Data Updates – Average Utilization










