a. Permit Status during COVID 19
 The permit cycle remains on hold due to the State of Emergency in Maryland.

- Data Update trips, vehicles, rides per vehicle per day
   Rides are low but increasing with warmer weather. Rides per vehicle per day
   have been around 1.
- b. Data Request Winter 2020 v. Winter 2021 trips In 2021 fewer trips were taken. The areas most affected are downtown and around universities. A greater share of rides in 2021 were adjacent to downtown and in the Pigtown area.

Release will include the PSA and a new Bike & scooter parking webpage -- this was delayed by snow. Locations include equity zones, North Ave Rising corrals, and corrals near the waterfront. Corrals are now live in Lime and Spin apps.

Matt Hendrickson: "Corrals look great, nice to see them in place!" Michael Kurlancheek: "+1 corrals look amazing"

Clarissa Chen: "super exciting! Will you all be able to send out the webpage link/where will that be? Is there a way to add the bike corrals/racks as a layer onto the city gis bike map?"

You can turn the bike rack layer on/off on the Bike Facility map. There will also corral and rack map on the bike parking page.

Patrick McMahon: request for corral analysis. Looking forward to seeing more along

Tereina Galloway: do apps communicate that preferred parking is nearby?

Spin currently shows you locations but doesn't notify you

Lime working on pop-up notifications

Miami is piloting parking notifications, and Tereina noticed neater parking in Miami when the scooter gave an audio notification

Michael Trentadue: recommends a notification at the start of ride for preferred parking

Robert Gardner: if you decide you want all scooters parked in corrals, there needs to be a corral network first (lessons learned from Miami and Tel Aviv). Figuring out best time to communicate to user
