

Instructions on How to use Interactive Map

Overview: The Overview section provides residents with information about resurfacing projects.

Tip 1: Residents can scroll through the overview section to find out more information about our Internal, External Projects and what they should expect to see on their street.

Tip 2: Residents can click on the top tab to view resurfacing projects. BCDOT has divided our projects in the following: Internal and External resurfacing.


Internal Resurfacing: These resurfacing projects are done by all internal BCDOT forces.

Tip 1: Residents can view all resurfacing projects that BCDOT's has planned, completed and are under construction.

Tip 2: Residents can click on any street in the middle row to view projects under construction.

Tip 3: Residents can also view all projects by sector and by independent district. The search button is located on the right-hand column of the map.

Step 4: Use the plus (+) or minus (-) buttons to zoom in and out of the interactive map.

Step 5: To find or look up a specific location, click the "Find my address or place" button . You will need to type in an address location in the field. Your results may vary based on your connection type, Internet service provider, physical location, network, and browser.


External Resurfacing: These resurfacing projects improve the city's transportation infrastructure by making roadways safer and more comfortable for all users. Work is performed by private contractors and managed by BCDOT.

Tip 1: Residents can view all resurfacing projects that BCDOT's has planned, completed and are under construction.

Tip 2: Residents can click on any street in the middle row to view projects under construction.

Tip 3: Residents can also view all projects by sector and by independent district. The search button is located on the right-hand column of the map.

Step 4: Use the plus (+) or minus (-) buttons to zoom in and out of the interactive map.
