***Dockless Vehicle*** (Ms. Meg Young)

- Byrd now has 100 E-bikes deployed each day
- Trips per vehicle per day is seeing about two trips
- NEW DATA! MTA is doing data collection regarding North Avenue Rising Project
  - Trips over I-83 has increased fourfold for scooters and e-bikes over the past 3 years
  - Working on Bike Counter program

***Automatic Bike Counters*** (Mr. Patrick Patterson – DOT Bike Planner)

- All information has been compiled and created a tier list
  - o First Tier means priority install for counters– 8 locations
    - East Monument and North Broadway
    - Guilford Ave and East Mount Royal Ave
  - o Second Tier (Install Second or Mixed Reporting) – 8 locations
    - Would do more pilots
    - MLK Blvd and Martin Street Cut-Through
    - Lake Montebello
  - o Third Tier (Install Later but need more information) – 16 locations
  - o Tube Counter on Jones Falls Trail side path at Guilford Avenue and Mount Royal, commissioners have asked to use to figure out if DOT should purchase for the future.

- This Framework, focused first and foremost on safety and equity, is an appropriate direction for the Bicycle Master Plan
  - All people agree or strongly agree
  - Open Discussion: Why did you answer the way you did?
    - Worried about Feasibility
    - Alignment with Mayor's Goals
    - Equitable should mean equitable distribution of a lot of bike facilities not equitable facilities of a few
    - Definitions of equity is an important part of the framework
  - Key Goals
  - Poll Question using 1 to 5 scale, where 1 is (too narrow) and 5 is (too broad)
    - Opinion of 6 Keys goals Clarity and focus and if they are comprehensive and thorough (A: Either Great Balance or Too Broad)
    - What is most important?
      - Figuring out political support will lead to funding
      - Figuring out how to combat anti-bike culture
  - Objectives
    - On a scale of 1-5 how appropriate is the balance between aspirational targets and achievable milestones. (People believed they were should be more achievable)
    - Need quantitative metrics mixed with a qualitative
