The location of the request will be investigated to determine if traffic calming is feasible. Arterial roads, truck and bus routes may require different treatments from a residential street.

Upon availability, deploy a Speed Sentry Test

camera to capture activity at the location for 7 davs.

If the data collected from the Speed Sentry Test camera indicates enough volume and speed to warrant traffic calming, a request will be submitted for design. If the data does not indicate sufficient volume and speed, the request will be denied. In either case the requestor will be emailed or mailed a letter of the determination.

The completed design will be sent to the Baltimore City Fire

Department for review.

Upon approval of the design, the affected community members and appropriate council representative will be contacted. Residents will be given 2 weeks to provide opposition to DOT on the recommended treatment. A variety of methods will be
